



Title: How to Improve Your Curb Appeal in 2 Weekend

You don't need a major renovation to make a strong first impression. Two focused weekends can refresh your home's exterior and create the kind of curb appeal that catches buyers' attention.

Weekend 1: Clean, Refresh & Repair

1. Pressure wash surfaces

Clean the driveway, walkways, porch, siding, and patio areas. Removing dirt and buildup can make everything look newer.

2. Refresh the front door

A freshly painted or cleaned front door instantly creates a welcoming focal point. Update worn hardware if needed.

3. Clean windows and light fixtures

Sparkling windows help the home look brighter and better maintained.

4. Handle small repairs

Walk around the exterior and check for:

- ✓ Loose house numbers
- ✓ Cracked caulking
- ✓ Broken screens

- ✓ Chipped paint
- ✓ Loose railings

5. Remove clutter

Put away garden tools, extra planters, hoses, toys, and anything that makes the exterior feel crowded.

Weekend 2: Landscape & Add Finishing Touches

1. Refresh landscaping

- ✂ Trim bushes and trees
- 🌿 Edge lawns and walkways
- 🌿 Remove weeds and dead plants

2. Add fresh mulch

New mulch creates a clean, polished appearance and instantly updates landscaping beds.

3. Add seasonal flowers or plants

Color near the front door or walkway can create warmth and visual interest.

4. Upgrade your entryway

Consider:

- ✨ A new welcome mat
- ✨ Coordinated planters
- ✨ Updated house numbers
- ✨ Outdoor seating accents

5. Improve outdoor lighting

Clean fixtures or replace outdated ones to brighten the home's appearance during evening showings.

Quick Rule:

Focus on **clean + maintained + inviting** rather than expensive upgrades. Buyers often notice how a home *feels* before they focus on square footage or features.

Bonus seller tip: Stand across the street and look at your home as if you were seeing it for the first time. The first three things you notice are usually the first three things buyers notice too.
